### **Homework Policy**

#### Aim:

- To reinforce what the child learns during the day.
- To provide a link between teacher and parent
- Children are expected to do their homework to the best of their individual ability no more- no less.

# 1. How often is homework given?

- Homework is given on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and at the discretion of the teacher.
- Sometimes at the discretion of the class teacher or principal, children are given "homework off" as a treat or as acknowledgement of some special occasion.
- Please note homework may sometimes be repeated during the week or weekend if a child has not done homework, made suitable effort or presented untidy work.

#### 2. What is the content of Homework?

- Ideally homework will contain a balance between reading tasks, learning tasks and writing tasks.
- Homework will regularly contain reading, spelling, tables, written work, pieces to be "learned by heart", drawing/colouring, collecting information/items and finishing work started in class.

# 3. How much time to be spent on Homework

The following are guidelines only:
Senior/Junior Infants 20 minutes
1st & 2nd Class 40 minutes
3rd & 4th Class up to 50 minutes
5th & 6th Class up to 60 minutes

## 4. How much help should parents give?

- Parents should help their children with homework by:
- Providing them with a suitable place and time to do their homework to prevent interruptions or distractions, like TV. or other children.
- Children should do written homework themselves and parents should only help when the child has difficulty.
- Parents should check learning work and reading e.g. tables.
- Parents should support teacher's methodology.
- Paired reading is not homework in the regular sense and it is simply meant to be an enjoyable exercise between parent and child.

## 5. How often do teachers monitor homework?

- Ideally teachers like to check homework on a daily basis.
- As children get older and learn to work independently some items of homework are checked less often.
- Children may check some items of homework and class work under the direction of the teacher.

# 6. When should parents communicate with the teachers about homework and vice versa?

- On occasion when homework is not done or completed, this should be
  - communicated to the teacher by the parent.
- If individual teachers methodology varies to policy, it is communicated to the parent.
